A philosophical approach to ethical decision making that suggests that, when faced with a complex ethical dilemma, people simply do what they are most comfortable doing or do what they think a person they admire would do. The assumption is that people will be guided by their virtues to reach the "right" decision.

\_\_D\_\_ 10. An approach to ethical decision making that states that when we have a choice between alternative actions or social policies, we choose the one that has the **best overall consequence** for all persons directly or indirectly affected.

\_\_I\_\_ 11. An approach to ethical decision making that focuses on how fairly our actions and policies distribute **benefits and burdens** among those affected by the decision.

\_\_B\_\_12. An approach to ethical decision making that is based on a vision of society as a community whose members work together to achieve a **common set of values and goals**.
